**Narrator:** Hello, this month I wanted to talk about our security posture, what we do about security at Grain, you know our lanyards talk about us doing 20% of the UK's infrastructure, really a big number now and it makes us genuinely important to the UK. As such we get lots of help from the security services telling us about what we should be doing, having the right posture, having the right front face on security. But you know I'm not the right person to talk about this, clearly Rays the right man so ill hand over to him.

**Ray:** With the commissioning of phase 3 and the Jetty we've made a massive step change in security, not only just here and down in the Jetty control room but around the site perimeter as well as the existing electric fences, there's now a lot more security measures. At entrance points we have vehicles stopping ramps, around these are bollards and other architectural type features. We also have cameras and thermal images to feed high resolution images straight to the state-of-the-art control room. In addition to these measures we've also provided a home for the police peninsula liaison team here at Grain and all of these things act as a very visible deterrent to people that might think of targeting us plus it builds a great working relationship with the police having them based on our site. We provide a constant presence here on the Isle of Grain, our job is the protection of national infrastructure and it's very important that we have a smart base that we can work from here on the Isle of Grain in order to help us achieve our strategic objectives. We carry out patrols around the site in our vehicles and we're very much about deterring people here just by our presence, we also have a marine team on the Medway their job is to patrol the sites from the waters edge and also to help test out the detection systems that are available to us.

We exercise these systems regularly, indeed as part of the UK's preparations for the Olympic games a large-scale security exercise was conducted over a number of days on the Peninsula to test our readiness and response and it was great to see that these systems actually worked and were really effective.

However, we must not sit back but look at ways of carrying out improvement at present we are working with CPNI on new security initiatives, these initiatives actively promote the measures we use so that we both further deter people and also get everyone on board-actually working with security, together we've got this covered.

**Narrator:** So I really like that from Ray, the idea of together we have got this covered, you know such an important area for us across the site, we need to do everything we can to make sure we are as secure as possible, now you know new poster campaign coming out, keep your eyes out for that one and you know lets be obvious if you do see something please say something.
